WET WEATHER KIT

The problem of keeping dry, not for a few hours, but for days at a stretch, is a very difficult one, and we are inclined



to believe that rubberor oil-proofing alone gives absolute security under these conditions.

The disadvantages of rubber are ventilation and its liability to perish. The latter is not the serious objection that it would be in the tropics, and if precautions are taken not to fold the garment always in the same creases and to expose frequently to air, the proofing will last indefinitely, whilst proper ventilation is always possible in a roomy-cut garment.
